Commercial Road Test Checklist

A physical road test is required for evaluation of all new driver candidates. The test should be completed prior to hire, as part of the hiring process, not afterward. Any corrective actions should be addressed post-hire during the orientation process, before release for driving.

Drivers with less than 2 years of experience or younger than 23 years of age are required to perform a physical road evaluation at 30 days from hire and 90 days from hire.

PART 1 – PRE-TRIP AND EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT	
Checks general condition when approaching unit	
Looks for leakage of coolant, fuel and lubricants

Lines up units	
Connects glad hands to trailer to apply trailer brakes before coupling

Visually checks king pin assembly to be certain of proper coupling	
Checks coupling by applying hand valve or tractor protection valve (trailer air supply valve) and gently applying pressure, trying to pull away from	
trailer	
Assures that surface will support trailer before uncoupling	

A. ENGINE	
Places transmission in neutral before starting engine	
Starts engine without difficulty	
Allows proper warmup	
Understands gauges on instrument panel	
Maintains proper engine speed (rpm) while driving	
Does not abuse motor	
B. CLUTCH AND TRANSMISSION	
Starts loaded unit smoothly	
Uses clutch properly	
Times gearshifts properly	
Shifts gears smoothly	
Uses proper gear sequence	
C. BRAKES	
Knows proper use of tractor protection valve	
Understands low air warning	
Tests service brakes	
Builds full air pressure before moving	
D. STEERING	
Controls steering wheel	
Maintains good driving posture and good grip on wheel	
E. LIGHTS	
Knows lighting regulations	
Uses proper headlight beam	

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Dims lights when meeting or following other traffic	
Adjusts speed to range of headlights	

PART 4 – BACKING AND PARKING

A. BACKING

A. BACKING	
Gets out and checks surroundings before backing	
Looks back as well as uses mirror	
Gets out and rechecks conditions on long back	
Avoids backing from blind side	
Signals when backing	
Controls speed and direction properly while backing	
B. PARKING (City)	
Does not hit nearby vehicles or stationary objects	
Parks proper distance from curb	
Sets parking brake, puts in gear, check wheels and shuts off motor	
Checks traffic conditions and signals when pulling out from parked position	
Parks in legal and safe location	
C. PARKING (Road)	
Parks off pavement	
Avoids parking on soft shoulder	
Uses emergency warning signals when required	
Secures unit properly	

PART 5 – SLOWING AND STOPPING

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Stops smoothly without excessive fanning	
Stops before crossing sidewalk when coming out of driveway or alley	
Stops clear of pedestrian crosswalks	

PART 6 – OPERATING IN TRAFFIC, PASSING AND TURNING	
A. TURNING	
Signals intention to turn well in advance	
Gets into proper lane well in advance of turn	
Checks traffic conditions and turns only when intersection is clear	
Restricts traffic from passing on right when preparing to complete right-hand turn	
Completes turn promptly and safely and does not impede traffic	
B. TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SIGNALS	
Approaches signal prepared to stop if necessary	
Obeys traffic signal	
Uses good judgement on yellow light	
Starts smoothly on green	
Notices and heeds traffic signs	
Obeys stop signs	
C. INTERSECTIONS	
Adjusts speed to permit stopping if necessary	
Checks for cross traffic regardless of traffic controls	
Yields right-of-way for safety	
D. GRADE CROSSINGS	
Adjusts speed to conditions	
Makes safe stop, if required	
Selects proper gear and does not shift gears while crossing	
Knows and understands federal and state rules governing grade crossing	
E. PASSING	
Passes with sufficient clear space ahead	
Does not pass in unsafe locations: hills, curves and intersections	
Signals change of lanes	
Pulls out and backs with certainty	

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Does not tailgate (4 second rule)	
Does not block traffic with slow pass	
Allows enough room when returning to right lane.	
F. SPEED	
Uses speed consistent with ability	
Adjusts speed properly to road, weather and traffic conditions and legal limits	
Slows down for rough road	
Slows down in advance of curves, intersection, etc.	
Maintains consistent speed	
G. COURTESEY AND SAFETY	
Uses defensive driving techniques	
Yields right-of-way for safety	
Goes ahead when given right-of-way by others	
Does not crowd other drivers or force way through traffic	
Allows faster traffic to pass	
Keeps right and in own lane	
Uses horn only when necessary	
Is generally courteous and uses proper conduct
